

Names of God

| PARABLE | MEANING | COMMENTS, EXAMPLES |
|-----------------------------|---------------------------------------|---|
| Adonai | <i>Lord, Master</i> | Translated literally as "my lords," often used in place of YHWH |
| El | <i>God, The Strong One</i> | Used in names such as Isra-el (wrestles with God), Beth-el (House of God) |
| El Elohe Yisrael | <i>The God of Israel</i> | Jacob names alter after God blesses him, distinct from other false gods |
| El Elyon | <i>The God Most High</i> | Used with Abraham & in Psalms to express his extreme sovereignty |
| Elohim | <i>Rulers, judges, gods, angels</i> | Elohim refers to the beings in the spiritual world, used for Trinity at creation |
| El Olam | <i>The Everlasting God</i> | El means God & Olam means everlasting, forever, eternity |
| El Roi | <i>The God Who Sees Me</i> | Used by Hagar when God visited her & her son in the wilderness |
| El Shaddai | <i>Lord God Almighty</i> | All-Sufficient One, meeting needs as a mother would her children |
| Immanuel | <i>God With Us, I AM</i> | Isaiah prophesied the messiah would be called Immanuel, both God & man |
| Jehovah | <i>I AM, Self-Existent One</i> | All-Sufficient One, alternative transliteration for YHWH (Yahweh) |
| Jehovah-Jireh | <i>The Lord Will Provide</i> | Used by Abraham when God provided a ram instead of sacrificing Isaac |
| Jehovah-Mekaddishkem | <i>The Lord Who Sanctifies</i> | The Lord who sets you apart, holy, dedicate |
| Jehovah-Nissi | <i>The Lord Is My Banner</i> | Used once by Moses when they defeated the Amalekites, our focal point |
| Jehovah-Rapha | <i>The Lord Who Heals</i> | He heals our iniquities |
| Jehovah-Rohi | <i>The Lord Is My Shepherd</i> | God guides, rescues, protects his people. Jesus is the Good Shepherd |
| Jehovah-Sabaoth | <i>The Lord of Hosts & Armies</i> | He is Lord over all armies, Heaven and Earth |
| Jehovah-Shalom | <i>The Lord of Peace</i> | Gideon built an alter after God said, "Peace! Do not be afraid ..." |
| Jehovah-Shammah | <i>The Lord Is There</i> | Used once in Ezekiel, God had not abandoned Jerusalem and will restore it |
| Jehovah-Tsidkenu | <i>The Lord Our Righteousness</i> | God promises to impart his righteousness to us through his son, Jesus Christ |
| Yah or Jah | <i>I AM, Self-Existent One</i> | Shorter form or YHWH or Jehovah |
| YHWH | <i>I AM, Self-Existent One</i> | God reveals himself as Yahweh to Moses in Exodus 3, used more than any other name (6,519 times) |
